Program Background and Application Process Fiscal Year 2010

The Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE), through an appropriation from the Maryland General Assembly, provides funding to non-profit organizations to enable them to provide experiential, hands-on education programs for students and teachers throughout the State. The State Aided Educational Institutions (SAI) Program provides unique educational opportunities for students at designated sites around Maryland that can not be replicated in a classroom. Senate Bill 794 specifies the variety of procedures and requirements necessary to go through the Application process and to remain in the program.

Criteria for institutional eligibility include educational impact, budget request, number of students and/teachers projected to be served, and safety factors. Institutions applying for initial funding are further reviewed to ensure that their programs do not replicate existing programs, that programs are academically focused and student-centered, that the program(s) can be offered to a wide audience of students and teachers, is reasonably priced, and that the institution is well-managed, fiscally sound, and has a record of successful educational offerings.

Currently, thirty-eight institutions are funded through the SAI program. As Senate Bill 794 established selection criteria for eligibility and an application process and timeline, institutions have submitted funding applications for FY 2010. Each of the current institutions has submitted an application for baseline funding. Thirty-one of these institutions have also requested augmentation/enhancement funds. In addition, 18 new applicants submitted Fiscal Impact Statements, the first step in the budget process, requesting augmentation/enhancement funds. Sixteen of the 18 submitted applications. Thus, 84 applications have been reviewed for FY 2010 funding. Department Content Specialists reviewed the applications for program quality and contribution to department priorities. An interdepartmental review panel reviewed applications and submitted augmentation/enhancement recommendations to Dr. Nancy S. Grasmick, State Superintendent of Schools, who will, in turn, make final funding recommendations to the State Board of Education. Funding decisions for FY 2010 will be finalized at the Maryland State Department of Education's August 2008 Board Meeting.

Monitoring of the SAI programs includes an annual on-site visit by Department staff, a mid-year progress report, a final program report that verifies all services provided, and a telephone audit of end users.
