Culture That Shapes Character - We consciously and rigorously work to develop the character of every IFPCS student by dedicating the first twenty minutes of each school day to the teaching of positive character traits. We reinforce these teachings by incorporating character-forming rituals throughout the school day. Students also benefit from having monthly prominent character education speakers and award ceremonies.

Meaningful Community - We teach students the importance of community by working collaboratively with our parents, guardians and local community stakeholders in pursuit of our mission.

Forty-four percent of the students qualify for Free and Reduced Lunch. The school population is made up of students from the following communities: Suitland, District Heights, Capital Heights, Brandywine, Marlow Heights, Clinton, Largo, and Oxon Hill.

Program Highlights:

- Core Knowledge is used as the basic curriculum. It is augmented with supplemental resources in order to ensure alignment with Maryland Voluntary State Curriculum.
- Weekly collaborative planning sessions take place to ensure program implementation, and the pacing, and alignment of the Core Knowledge Curriculum with Maryland's Voluntary State Curriculum.
- Ongoing afterschool MSA enrichment programs provide extended learning opportunities for students who scored basic or below on the Maryland School Assessment in reading and math.
- Lincoln has adopted Lexia Reading and Symphony Math as web based programs to provide remediation and differentiation of instruction. The staff has participated in ongoing staff development in order to use these programs. Incorporated in this program are the principles from the Institutes for Learning from the University of Pittsburg, a program being used by PGCPS which includes Learning Walks and Accountable Talk, Clear Expectations, Socializing Intelligence and Academic Rigor.

The school is mission driven and requires parent participation at all levels. The more parents are involved in the process, the better the performance by the students. Imagine Lincoln Public Charter School Agreement requires parents are to complete a minimum of two hours of volunteer service to the school. To this goal, we endeavor to provide an open, warm, and welcoming environment

- An arts integration program with exposure and collaboration of the arts within the curriculum.
- A **reading program** that emphasizes phonics in the primary grades as well as development of rich vocabulary, comprehension and fluency using a variety of literature.
- **Emphasis on the basic skills** of reading fluency, writing, grammar, spelling, oral communication, computation, and problem solving.
- Character education that is integrated into all classes and subject areas.
- Math, science and history curricula that emphasize sequential learning, mastery of critical skills, and project-based activities that accesses various learning styles.
