SUBJECT: Changes to COMAR 13A.07.06.01, Programs for Professionally Certified Personnel

ADOPT

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this item is to adopt proposed changes regarding COMAR 13A.07.06.01, Programs for Professionally Certified Personnel.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

This regulation is one that provides direction on the teacher and principal preparation program approval process. It has not been updated since 1998. The Professional Standards and Teacher Education Board [PSTEB] approved changes to this regulation at its February 7, 2013 meeting and you granted permission to publish. The publication date was May 3, 2013. There were no comments submitted during the publication period which ended June 3, 201.

These changes are substantive, editorial changes to this regulation but are non-controversial changes. Language has been updated to reflect: (1) a change to more generic language to allow for ongoing modification in State and federal requirements, and (2) a citation correction within this regulation.

SUMMARY:

Changes to COMAR 13A.07.06.01, Programs for Professionally Certified Personnel will provide updated language and correct a citation.

The Professional Standards and Teacher Education Board proposes to amend Regulation .01 under COMAR 13A.07.06 Programs for Professionally Cartified Personnel. This action was considered at the Pebruary 7, 2013, meeting of the Professional Standards and Teacher Education Board.

Statement of Purpose

The purpose of this action is to correct the statutory authority and make a change to more generic language to allow for ongoing modification in State and federal requirements.

.01 Program Approval.

A. The process for the approval of programs that prepare professionally certified personnel shall include the use of [State] Department-approved standards. The [Maryland State] Department [of Education (MSDE)] shall approve standards that are performance based, reflect contemporary thinking, and are supported by research, best practice, and expert opinion. [These may include the standards of the National Council for the Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE), the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards (NBPTS), the Interstate New Teacher Assessment and Support Consortium (INTASC), or standards developed and validated by other national organizations or by the MSDE.] All Marylandapproved programs for teacher certification [and reading

certification] shall also include reading courses [for certification] in early childhood, elementary, secondary, [N] PreK-12, and generic special education (all levels) under COMAR [13A.12.01. 08A(5)(a)—(c)] 13A.12.01. 11A(5)(a)—(c).

There is no corresponding federal standard to this proposed action.

L Summary of Lonomic Impact. These regulations will lave minimal economic impact on individuals or firms that wish to provide canine scent detections services for pests in the State of Maryland. Individuals or firms wishing to provide these services are required to obtain a either a Pesticide Business License or Pest Control Consultant License and must employ at least one individual who holds a pesticide applicator or pest control consultant certificate in those pest control categories for which the licensee wishes to provide canine scent detection services.
