SUBJECT:

Transition from Current High School Assessments to PARCC High School

Assessments

PURPOSE:

To request that the State Board adopt the framework for transitioning from the current High School Assessments to the PARCC High School Assessments

BACKGROUND:

Attached are charts that highlight the suggested changes as Maryland transitions from the current high school assessment instruments in 2013-2014 to the PARCC high school assessment instrument in 2014-2015. The charts and accompanying "Frequently Asked Questions" (FAQs) include the High School Graduation Assessment Requirements, High School Assessment Requirements and the Bridge Validation Program. Since the transition period covers multiple school years, there are charts that highlight the expected requirements for students who enter ninth grade during the 2013-2014 school year as well as requirements for students who enter ninth grade in 2014-2015. These documents will be used by LEAs to inform communications with staff, students and parents.

The FAQs provide answers to questions and address various scenarios related to a student's participation in the high school assessment program as part of the state graduation requirements. Initial drafts of these documents were provided to the State Board at the January 28, 2014 meeting. Both the FAQs and the transition charts will be discussed during the State Board meeting on Tuesday, February 25, 2014.

ACTION:

I am requesting that the State Board adopt the framework for transitioning from the current High School Assessment instruments to the PARCC Assessment instruments.

High School Assessments

1. If the Algebra/Data Analysis HSA is taken in middle school in the 2013-2014 school year and passed, does the student have to take PARCC Algebra I in 9th grade? What if the student fails the test in 8th grade?

A student <u>who passed</u> the Algebra/Data Analysis HSA in grade 8 in school year 2013-14 <u>would not</u> take PARCC Algebra I in 9th grade. A student <u>who failed</u> the Algebra/Data Analysis HSA in grade 8 in school year 2013-14 <u>would</u> take PARCC Algebra I in 9th grade.

A student who passed the Algebra/Data Analysis HSA in grade 7 or below in school year 2013-14 and earned high school credit for their algebra course will not be required to take the PARCC Algebra I test in 2014-15 or in a future school year . However, a student who failed the Algebra/Data Analysis HSA in grade 7 or below in school year 2013-14 will need to take PARCC Algebra I in 2014-15 or in a future school year.

2. High school assessment information previously shared with LEAs indicates that 10th graders in 2014-2015 will take PARCC English 10 and yet Bridge Program information previously shared does not state that. Could you clarify this high school English transition?

Students who entered 9th grade in 2013-2014 will take PARCC English 10 in 2014-2015.

3. How many PARCC administrations will be available in the 2014-2015 school year?

There will be three PARCC administrations during the 2014-2015 school year; November/December 2014, March/May 2015, and Summer 2015.

* After the 2014-2015 school year, must school systems participate in all PARCC administrations offered during a school year?

School systems with block scheduling will participate in the November/December and March/May administrations. School systems with year-long courses will participate in the March/May administration. School systems that offer summer school programs in the tested areas, can use the Summer 2015 administration for students receiving remediation and/or taking credit-bearing courses.

4. Can a student retake a PARCC assessment more than once in a school year?

Yes, after completing the associated Maryland's College and Career-Ready-aligned course, a student can participate in any of the PARCC administrations offered in the remaining portion of that school year. For example, a student first taking a PARCC assessment during the November/December administration can retake the test in the subsequent March/May and/or Summer administration.

5. What are the passing scores for the PARCC assessments? Will there be a combined score option for PARCC?

Standard setting will take place in Summer 2015 to identify passing cut scores for all PARCC assessments. After that a combined score option will be identified for the PARCC assessments required for graduation.

6. After 2013-2014, will there continue to be five HSA administrations each school year?

Yes, each school year will continue to include the October, January, May, and Summer administrations, and for Seniors only, the April administration.

7. Will HSAs continue to be offered in both paper/pencil and online format after 2013-2014?

The HSAs will be offered in both paper/pencil and online format in the 2014-2015, 2015-2016, and 2016-2017 school years. Starting with the 2017-2018 school year, the HSAs will be offered online, with paper/pencil only available for students with IEPs that preclude taking the assessments online.

8. What will be the last administration of the Algebra/Data Analysis HSA and the English HSA?

The last administration for both the Algebra/Data Analysis HSA and the English HSA will be the May 2016 administration.

- Will HSA Biology and HSA Government continue as graduation assessment requirements?
 Yes.
- 10. What high school assessments do students take to determine "College and Career" readiness?

The PARCC English 11 and PARCC Algebra II assessments will be taken to determine "College and Career" readiness.

High School Graduation Assessment Requirements

1. If a student currently enrolled in high school fails an Algebra/Data Analysis course at the end of the 2013-2014 and also fails the Algebra/Data Analysis HSA this spring (2014), and then takes an Algebra I, Maryland College-and-Career Ready course during the 2014-2015 school year, is this student's high school graduation requirement Algebra/Data Analysis HSA or PARCC Algebra I?

In this scenario, the student's high school graduation assessment requirement would be the Algebra/Data Analysis HSA.

* What if a student passes the Algebra I course but fails the Algebra/Data Analysis HSA in the school year 2013-2014, does the student retake the Algebra/Data Analysis HSA or take PARCC Algebra I assessment to meet their graduation assessment requirement?

In this scenario, the student would retake the Algebra/Data Analysis HSA and could move to the Bridge Validation Program after two failed attempts at the test.

* Would the answers to these questions also apply to a student taking English 10 in the 2013-2014 school year?

Yes, a student who takes English 10 in the 2013-2014 school year and fails the English HSA would continue to be required to meet the high school graduation assessment requirement by retaking the English HSA.

2. Students entering 9th grade in 2014-2015 will take PARCC Algebra I to meet the high school graduation requirement. What if a student has not passed the PARCC Algebra I assessment by 12th grade? Will he/she be able to take it again in 12th grade or will he/she have to meet the graduation requirement through the Bridge Validation Program?

In this scenario, if the student has attempted PARCC Algebra I at least two times, he/she has the option to take the PARCC Algebra I assessment again in the November/December 2017 administration or participate in the Bridge Validation Program.

3. Have students in 8th grade who take and pass the Algebra/Data Analysis HSA in the 2013-2014 school year met their Algebra graduation assessment requirement?

Yes, 8th graders in the 2013-2014 school year who take and pass the Algebra/Data Analysis HSA have met their Algebra graduation assessment requirement.

* What about 7th graders who take and pass the Algebra/Data Analysis HSA in the 2013-2014 school year?

Students in 7th grade, or below, who take and pass the Algebra/Data Analysis HSA have met their Algebra graduation assessment requirement only if they are receiving high school credit for their algebra course.

4. Can students who are meeting their graduation assessment requirements through HSA retake the tests more than 2 times or must they move to the Bridge Validation Program after two failed attempts?

Students have the option to continue to take the HSA(s) to meet the required combined score option <u>or</u> they can choose to move to the Bridge Validation Program after two failed attempts.

5. Beginning in the 2014-2015 school year, what will be the "exemption" requirements for 10th grade through 12th grade out-of-state transfer students?

The current "exemption" criteria as stated in COMAR 13A.03.02.12.B(2) will continue to be applicable to out-of-state students who transfer in as 10th, 11th, or 12th graders.

6. What will be the graduation requirements for out-of-state transfer students who need to take high school assessments?

Out-of-state transfer students who are expected to graduate in 2014-2015, 2015-2016, or 2016-2017 will meet their high school assessment requirements by taking the HSAs. Out-of-state transfer students who graduate after the 2016-2017 school year, will meet their high school assessment requirements by taking the PARCC assessments.

7. What are the high school graduation assessment requirements for those students who entered 9th grade in the school years prior to the 2013-2014 school year (2012-2013, 2011-2012, 2010-2011)? Are any of these PARCC assessments required for graduation?

Students who entered grade 9 prior to the 2013-2014 school year will meet their high school graduation assessment requirements by taking the HSAs; no PARCC assessments will be needed as graduation requirements.

8. Some students will be meeting their graduation assessment requirements by taking the Algebra/Data Analysis HSA and the PARCC English 10. Will there be a new combined score option that these students will need to meet or will they still meet either the 1208 or 1602 scores?

Standard setting for the PARCC tests will occur in Summer 2015. The passing score identified in that process for PARCC English 10 will be used to calculate the combined score option total students will need in order to meet their graduation assessment requirements with a combination of HSA and PARCC tests.

Bridge Validation Program

1. When will the 1st assessment administration occur as part of the Bridge Validation Program?

Students enrolled in Algebra I, HSA Biology, HSA Government may take the test for the first time as early as 9th grade depending upon their enrollment in the course. The first administration of English 10 will occur once the students complete the English 10 course, usually during their second year of high school.

2. After the 1st administration of assessments, when will students be able to participate in the 2nd administration of the tests before beginning the Bridge Validation Program?

3. Will there be a Bridge Validation Program for the PARCC assessments? Will the participation requirements be the same as they are for the HSAs?

Yes, there will be a Bridge Validation Program for the PARCC assessments. The criteria for participating in a PARCC Bridge Validation Program will remain the same.

4. Students entering 9th grade in 2014-2015 will take PARCC Algebra I to meet the high school graduation requirement. What if a student has not passed the PARCC Algebra I assessment by 12th grade? Will he/she be able to take it again in 12th grade or will he/she have to meet the graduation requirement through the Bridge Program?

In this scenario, if the student has attempted PARCC Algebra I at least two times, he/she has the option to take the PARCC Algebra I assessment again in the November/December 2017 administration or participate in the Bridge Validation Program.

5. Can students who are meeting their graduation assessment requirements through HSAs retake the tests more than 2 times or must they move to the Bridge Validation Program after two failed attempts?

Students have the option to continue to take the HSA(s) to meet the required combined score option or they can choose to move to the Bridge Validation Program after two failed attempts.

6. If a student's 2nd HSA failure was during the October HSA administration or January HSA administration, does the student have to wait until the summer to start bridge projects or can he/she start them during that current school year?

A student can participate in the Bridge Validation Program, as soon as they have met the required criteria as stated in COMAR 13A.03.02.09.C(2).
