2014 High School Principal of the Year Larissa Santos of Edgewood High School

Ms. Larissa Santos has served as the Principal of Edgewood High School since 2007. She graduated from The University of Texas in San Antonio with a Bachelor's degree in Political Science and Texas A&M International University with a Master's degree in Science Education.

Ms. Santos began her educational career in Texas first as a classroom teacher before becoming an Assistant Principal at Uvalde High School in the Uvalde Consolidated I.S.D. In 2001, Ms. Santos moved to Maryland where she became a Assistant Principal at Edgewood High School prior to her promotion to Principal.

During her time at Edgewood High school Ms. Santos has served as a board member for the Greater Excellence in Education Foundation, graduated from the Harford Leadership Academy, was the Recipient of the 2007 Educator Excellence for Minority Achievement Award representing Harford County and oversaw the construction of Edgewood High School.

Ms. Santos is a 3rd Degree Black Belt in Goshin Jutsu Karate. She currently resides with her family in Harford County.

Susan Evans of Ridgely Middle School 2014 Middle School Principal of the Year

Susan Evans began her tenure as principal of Ridgely Middle School (RMS) in the Baltimore County Public Schools (BCPS) on July 1, 2003, with a focus on creating a middle school with a culture of excellence, where all students succeed in a caring and supportive environment. Ridgely Middle School was observed to be a good school. However, Mrs. Evans knew and shared that RMS had incredible potential to be a great school. Through positive relationship building with all stake-holders, focused professional development, increased before and afterschool activities for students, and setting high expectations that all students will succeed, just three years later, Ridgely Middle School was recognized by the Maryland State Department of Education as a 2006 Maryland Blue Ribbon School, and by the United States Department of Education as a National Blue Ribbon School.

Under Mrs. Evans' leadership, for each of the past 11 years, RMS has met state achievement standards in reading, math and science in each tested sub-group. The school has since continued its journey of educational excellence to offer students coursework opportunities in gifted and talented classes, where special education students are included in the total school program, where students are encouraged to keep trying until they 'get it', where students have a myriad of choices of before and after school activities, and are taught and encouraged to take leadership roles.

Mrs. Evans has worked 39 years in secondary education, all in the BCPS. Prior to her appointment at Ridgely Middle School, she served as assistant principal of Stemmers Run, Deep Creek and Old Court Middle Schools. In Mrs. Evans previous school, she was part of an administrative team whose school was recognized as the Most Improved School in the Southern Regional Education Board (SREB) network (2002). Additionally, she worked as science department chair, grade level leader, team leader and science teacher in three additional

Baltimore County middle schools. Mrs. Evans has held various leadership roles in each of her schools for the past 33 years.

Mrs. Evans holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Biology and Education from Towson State College (Towson University) and a Master of Science degree in Technologies for Educators from The Johns Hopkins University. She is a resident of Baltimore County and enjoys spending time with family, traveling, photography, and reading.

She and her husband, Thomas, have a blended family; one that 'specializes' in education. Sue is extremely proud of each one of her family members. Tom is the principal of Eastern Technical High School. Sue and her husband are each recognized for leading schools to Maryland and National Blue Ribbon status as well as being recognized as a MASSP Principal of the Year. Sue's son, Justin Nash, is athletic director and special educator at Dundalk High School. Daughter-in-law, Erika Nash, is an English teacher at Towson High School. And, step-daughter, Kristen Evans, is a para-educator at Battle Grove Elementary School. Additional family members include step-son, Thomas Evans and family, step-daughter, Sarah White and family, and four grandsons and one granddaughter. Sue shares, "All the work that we do with and for students is with the intention of making our world a better place for future generations."
